Scheduling Procedure Screening tip:

Did you know your reasoning (or diagnostic code) for having a procedure done could make all the difference in the world for **YOUR** cost?

When scheduling your **Initial Colonoscopy**, patients over 50 that make any mention of the words: "Family History," will have their first colonoscopy code changed to a "Diagnostic" code and therefore be charged.
